Initial Community Vision Timeline	
Time Period	Actions Completed
December 2012	Grand County Moab Tailings Project Steering Committee establishes Site Futures Sub-committee (SFC) to develop a community vision for the former Atlas Mill site.
January 2013	Partner entities (Grand County, Moab City, NPS, and BLM) appoint representatives to SFC. Steering Committee and advertises for and selects three "citizens at large" to serve on the SFC
February through April 2013	SFC organizes, designs planning process and sets goal of presenting a community vision for the Mill Site by December 2013. SFC members tour Mill site, learn about site constraints and opportunities, and obtain input from partner entities. Utah Division of Fire, Forestry, and State Lands added as partner entity due to property interest at Mill Site.
May 2013	SFC initiates public involvement and comment process with news release and other notifications. SFC holds planning workshop on May 15 at Grand Center to educate public about the planning process and the Mill Site and gather suggestions about potential future public uses at the site. County begins accepting suggestions and comments online.
Summer 2013	SFC reviews public and partner input, comments, and suggestions and develops four concept alternatives for public review: 1) Restoration & Trails (minimal development), 2) Community Park (modest development), 3) Commercial Use (development emphasized), and 4) Combined Use (mix of concepts from other alternatives)
Fall 2013	SFC advertises opportunity for additional public involvement and hosts public workshop on September 18 at Grand Center to obtain comment on the four concept alternatives. SFC reviews comments and partner input and prepares the Initial Community Vision for presentation.
November 2013	SFC presents Community Vision to the Grand County Moab Tailings Project Steering Committee on November 13. The Steering Committee unanimously endorses the vision. The SFC and the members of the Steering Committee present the Initial Community Vision to a joint meeting of the Grand County and Moab City Councils on November 21.
January 2014	The Grand County Council approves the Initial Community Vision on January 21 st by Resolution 3015 with additional provisions. These include 1) a request for the Department of Energy to transfer the Mill Site Property to Grand County upon completion of the remediation project; 2) a declaration of intent by the county that future uses of the property shall provide substantial social and economic benefits to residents and visitors to Moab and Grand County; 3) a provision that at least every five years the Steering Committee may direct the SFC to review and update the Initial Community Vision using a public and agency public input process and to coordinate the reviews and updates with other planning processes; 4) that the Steering Committee shall notify the Grand County Council of any substantive update to the Community Vision and 5) that the County Council reserves the right endorse or reject any substantive future revisions to the Community Vision. On January 28 th 2014, the Moab City Council adopted Resolution 11-2014 approving the Initial Community Vision with the same provisions except that the 4) and 5) above would also apply to the City.
